

Expected Outcomes of the Meeting

- Establishment of Africa CDC experts committee for expedited access to and update of diagnostics in Africa to meet it health strategy agenda.
- Development of a standardized protocol on evaluation of diagnostics, and criteria for selection and capacity building for Centers of excellence in Africa.
- Establishment of partnerships for a blueprint for a diagnostics revolving fund, designed to accelerate manufacturing of diagnostics in Africa.
- Accomplishment of a consensus on a mechanism to facilitate uptake of diagnostics in Africa.
- Launching of an HIV viral load movement, as proof of concept of the AFCAD, to increase uptake and access to meet programme targets.
